Hymn Festival "The Faith We Sing" with David Cherwien, St Paul's Church Augusta - Sept. 30, 2023

Come and join us as we sing together in a Hymn Festival led and accompanied by David Cherwien, with the American Guild of Organists and the family of Dale Hesse.

David Cherwien serves as Cantor at Mt. Olive Lutheran Church, Minneapolis, MN and recently retired after 21 years as Artistic Director for the National Lutheran Choir. He completed the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in organ performance and the Master of Arts degree in Theory and Composition from the University of Minnesota; with undergraduate work in organ performance and choral music education at Augsburg College, Minneapolis. Studying at the Berlin Church Music School in Germany in improvisation with Renate Zimmermann and other fine teachers, he also studied organ with Christian Baude in Aix-en-Provence, France, with Paul Manz and other distinguished American Music Professors.

A Prolific composer with over 150 publications of choral and organ music, he is the 2007 winner of the Raabe Prize for Excellence in Sacred Composition for his piece "The Souls of the Righteous". David is a founding member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians and is active in the American Guild of Organists and Choristers Guild. He is well known for bringing creativity to hymn accompaniment and singing, utilizing many styles that engage the participants and provide a deep and authentic faith that lifts up our hearts and glorifies God.

The first meeting of the fall season will take place at Congregation Children of Israel at 3005 Walton Way. We’ll gather at 7pm for a meal of homemade lasagna, salad, bread, and dessert (\$10 per person. RSVP to markdickens81@icloud.com). During this time we’ll celebrate the successful summer AGO convention.

Following dinner a program of music for the upcoming Jewish High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur will be presented by soprano, Melissa Schultz and Mark Dickens. Soprano Melissa Schultz’s voice has been hailed as “shimmering and strong”. Her local appearances include performing as the soprano soloist in Schubert’s *Mass in G*, Hasse’s *Laudate Pueri*, Brahms’s *Requiem* and Dan Forrest’s *Requiem for the Living* with USC Aiken (2018-2021), the Augusta Choral Society in Handel’s *Messiah* (2017), the Augusta Opera’s Holiday Concert (2012) and as a chorus member with the Augusta Symphony for Beethoven’s 9th Symphony, Bach’s *Mass in B Minor*, Faure’s *Requiem*, and Mozart’s *Requiem*. Additional oratorio appearances as a soloist include Handel’s *Messiah*, Haydn’s *Creation*, Vivaldi’s *Gloria* and *Magnificat*, Bach’s *Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland*, Faure’s *Requiem* and Brahms’ *Requiem*.



Operatic performances include Contessa (*Le Nozze di Figaro*), both First and Second Lady (*Die Zauberflöte*) in multiple productions, Kate (*The Ballad of Baby Doe*), Salud (*La Vida Breve*), Yum Yum (*The Mikado*), and Monica (*The Medium*).

Ms. Schultz holds degrees in music from The University of Lethbridge (Bachelor of Music) and UNC-Greensboro (Master of Music/Vocal Performance). She currently lives in Augusta, GA where she teaches private voice lessons, conducts the children's choir at First Presbyterian Church, and maintains an active performing schedule as an oratorio soloist.
