Abigail Crafton



The American Guild of Organists, Augusta Chapter (AGO Augusta) presents Ms. Abigail Crafton in concert at St. John United Methodist Church, 736 Greene Street, Augusta, Ga on Saturday, February 17th at 3 pm, with a reception to follow. Admission is free.

Ms. Crafton is the winner of the Southeast AGO/Quimby Regional Competition for Organists in June, 2023 held in Augusta. She is a high school junior and has studied piano since the age of three, singing since the age of four, and began studying the trumpet in elementary school. At the age of ten she began the organ, which she requested when she was three.

Abigail has played principal trumpet in the Armstrong Youth Orchestra, and has been first chair Georgia All-State in 2021, 2022, and 2023. Abigail is the Organ Scholar at the Cathedral Basilica of St. John the Baptist in Savannah, where she also sings soprano. Abigail studies organ with Dr. Paul Thornock, and was one of the top three competitors in the Baylor University High School Organ Competition this past November. 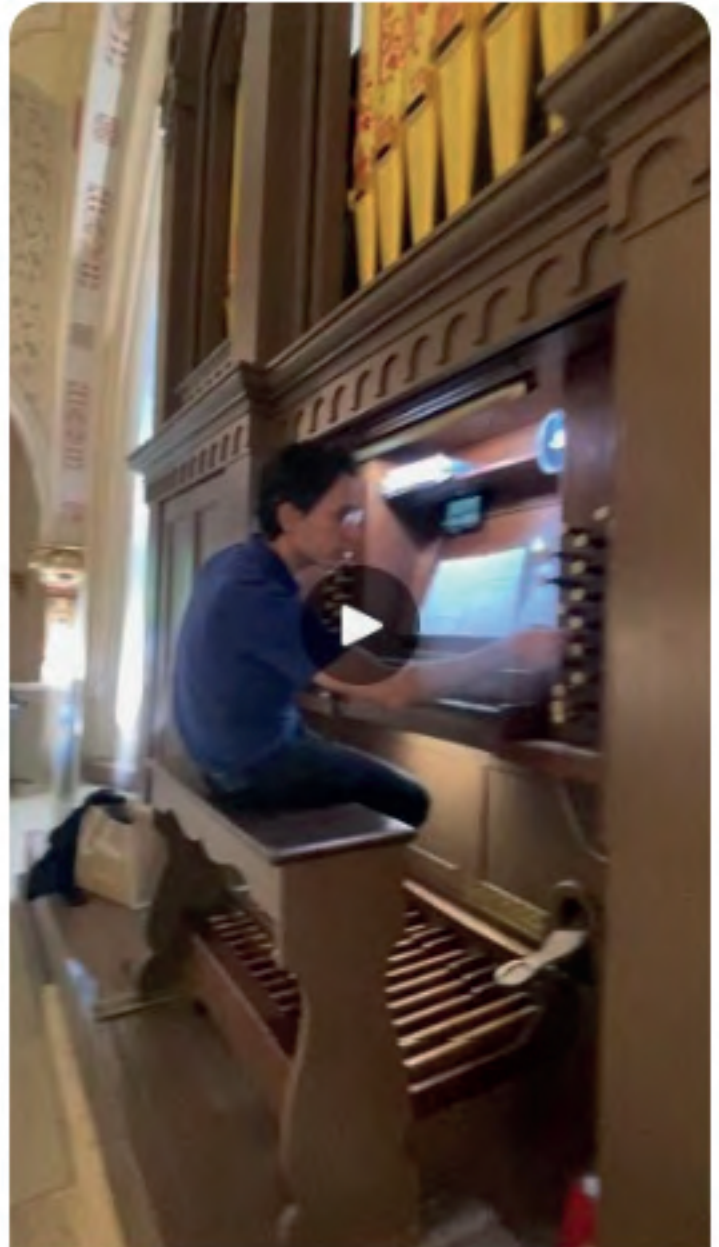

Dr. Robert Leftwich, PhD

1940-2024

Born on July 2, 1940, Dr. Robert Eugene Leftwich, PhD passed away peacefully on January 13, 2024, due to covid complications. A Texas native, he grew up in Longmont, Colorado.

Robert attended Baylor University, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in 1963. He continued his education obtaining a Master's Degree at Northern Illinois University in 1970, and a Doctorate in Philosophy of Nursing Education in 1977 from Clayton University, St. Louis, Missouri.

Upon graduation, Robert worked as an oncology nurse at Baylor University Hospital in Dallas, Texas and taught at Governors State University. He was a respected and accomplished oncology nurse and teacher.

For many years Robert was known as a man of deep faith and a talented vocalist and church organist. Later in life he served as a full-time music director and organist before retiring in 2005 to Augusta, GA. He was a member of the Augusta Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and a longtime fan of classical opera.

An Air Force Veteran, Robert was interned at Westover Memorial Gardens in a private ceremony.
