## Meet the member: Elizabeth Gatter



Elizabeth Gatter serves as Organist and Choirmaster at Church of the Good Shepherd. Her husband, Tony Gatter is the Chair of Religious Life at EDS. Her path to the organ began during undergrad when, looking to drop her piano major (and a few recitals), she convinced her pianist mother to let her trade it for organ lessons—despite concerns that a vocal performance degree might lead to starving artist status (it didn’t!). Elizabeth’s first organ teacher, Dr. Randy Sheets, deeply shaped her approach to rehearsal and leadership through both instruction and example. One of her most memorable moments came in 2022 when she conducted Rutter’s Mass of the Children with Mobile’s Singing Children, the choir she herself once sang in—coming full circle from a 2006 performance under her own mentor.

Elizabeth’s favorite piece to play is Karg-Elert’s “Nun danket alle Gott,” which, in her words, “just hits.” She’s drawn to composers like John Rutter, Emma Lou Diemer, and William Mathias, and isn’t afraid to admit that her listening tastes lean heavily toward girl pop—think Tate McCrae and Renee Rapp. A fun fact? She performs in an organ duo called DUO24, formed with her predecessor at the Cathedral, and the collaboration has reignited her joy for performing—“being at the console together just makes it more fun.” If not an organist, she’d be a voice teacher, and her advice to emerging musicians is this: “There is no more valuable resource than your colleagues. Also, don’t stop seeking mentorship once college ends—you have something to learn from everyone!”


**Church of the Good Shepherd** in Augusta, GA, is now accepting applications for the 2025-2026 Organ Scholar Program. Church of the Good Shepherd is the largest church in the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia, with two children’s choirs (one RSCM) and an adult choir. We share a campus with Episcopal Day School, a well-regarded K-8th school for which we provide chapel services three times a week. Our Sunday services are at 8:30am, 11am, and 6pm, all supported by the organ.

**Program:** The goal of our Organ Scholar Program is to support and equip a young musician in discerning their career path and experiencing deep work within a significant church music program. The Organ Scholar will gain experience in programming, playing, and leading ensembles, as well as learning about the logistics of a church music program. They may also be called upon to sing and conduct, depending on the candidate’s particular interests and skills. The Organ Scholar will also give a solo or collaborative recital at the discretion of the Director of Music. They will be encouraged to seek mentorship both within the program and in the surrounding area, making the most of their year in Augusta.

**Eligibility:** We recognize that not all organists come to the profession by a traditional path, and thus are accepting applications from all organists ages 16-30, regardless of degree program or education status.

**Compensation:** We offer a stipend of \$20,000 paid across the duration of the program. The start date of the program is August 14th, ending in late July of 2026. These dates are flexible depending on our desired candidate’s needs. While we do not offer permanent housing, we can provide overnight housing for candidates who may be commuting outside the metro area on Wednesday evenings, Saturday evenings, and for select busy seasons.

To apply, email your resume (CV preferred but not required) and a recording of 1-2 pieces of solo repertoire and one hymn to our Director of Music, Elizabeth Gatter at [music@cogsaugusta.org](mailto:music@cogsaugusta.org). Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until filled. Live auditions will be held at Church of the Good Shepherd at a time determined by the committee and candidate.
